

## Rules for Participating in the FMU Clothesline Project:

- 1. Don't name the perpetrator.
- 2. Name the victim ONLY if you have permission (or it's you).
- 3. Stuff some cardboard inside the shirt so the markers don't bleed through.
- 4. It's nice to use the color code (below) for the words, but feel free to decorate with other colors.
- 5. T-shirts will become the property of FMU. They will be displayed all week.

## The shirts are color coded to show the form of abuse and whether the victim survived the abuse they experienced.

White represents women who died because of violence:

Yellow or beige represents battered or assaulted women;

Red, pink, and orange are for survivors of rape and sexual assault;

Blue and green t-shirts represent survivors of incest and sexual abuse;

Purple or lavender represents women attacked because of their sexual orientation;

Black is for women attacked for political reasons.
