



Rules for Participating in the FMU Clothesline Project:

1. Don't name the perpetrator.
2. Name the victim ONLY if you have permission (or it's you).
3. Stuff some cardboard inside the shirt so the markers don't bleed through.
4. It's nice to use the color code (below) for the words, but feel free to decorate with other colors.
5. T-shirts will become the property of FMU. They will be displayed all week.

The shirts are color coded to show the form of abuse and whether the victim survived the abuse they experienced.

White represents women who died because of violence;

Yellow or **beige** represents battered or assaulted women;

Red, **pink**, and **orange** are for survivors of rape and sexual assault;

Blue and **green** t-shirts represent survivors of incest and sexual abuse;

Purple or **lavender** represents women attacked because of their sexual orientation;

Black is for women attacked for political reasons.
